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## Speaker Bios



### **Vicky Pryce, CEBR**

Vicky was previously Senior Managing Director at FTI Consulting, (2010-2013), Director General for Economics at the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS), (2002-2010) and Joint Head of the UK Government Economic Service. Before that she was Partner at London Economics and Partner and Chief Economist at KPMG after holding senior economic positions in banking and the oil sector.

Vicky co-founded GoodCorporation in 2000, a company set up to promote corporate social responsibility and in 2010-11 served as Master of the Worshipful Company of Management Consultants. She is a Freeman and Liveryman of the City of London. She has also been the author of numerous publications, including 'Green Business, Green Value and Sustainability (co-editor), Routledge(2011); 'Restarting Britain' Design Education and Growth report (co-author), Design Commission,2012 ; 'Greeconomics: The Euro crisis and Why Politicians Don't Get It', Biteback Publishing(2013); 'Prisonomics', Biteback( 2013); 'It's the Economy Stupid, Economics for Voters', with Ross and Urwin, Biteback, (2015); 'Why Women Need Quotas', with Stefan Stern, Biteback( 2015)and 'Redesigning Manufacturing', with Nielsen and Beverland, Macmillan(2015).



### **Michel Noiry, Consult'in France**
